

Tree Seedling Program – 2017

The St. Clair Region Conservation Authority (SCRCA) offers to private landowners, native tree seedlings, planting services, and maintenance agreements. There is no minimum acreage required to order seedlings.

Seedlings Planted by the Conservation Authority

Planting projects eligible for SCRCA planting include windbreaks, buffer strips, wildlife corridors, erosion control and retiring agricultural land. The SCRCA will provide;

- a site visit, a planting plan, and recommendations for preparing the site(s)
- planting services and one applications of pre-emergent herbicide
- survival assessment after one years growing season
- additional herbicide applications up to three years for an additional cost

Planting Service Fees

- Seedling Tree Planting Services Machine Planting:

500 to 950 trees	\$950/site
1000 to 1950 trees	\$0.95/tree
2000 plus trees	\$0.90/tree

Fees include planting and initial herbicide application. 15% Reduction of fees on solid Coniferous Plantations

- Seedling Tree Planting Services Refill Hand Planting:

Up to 500 trees	\$750.00/site
500 plus trees	\$1.50/tree

This price includes the planting and 1 applications of herbicide

landowners must prepare the planting area prior to spring planting by providing a level and vegetation free site

Additional Maintenance (Recommended 3 additional tending)

0 to 1000 trees	\$300.00/application
1000 plus trees – applied by machine sprayer	\$0.30/tree/application
1000 plus trees – applied by backpack sprayer	\$0.40/tree/application
1000 plus trees – tank mix of multiple chemicals	\$0.50/tree/application

- Tending includes one application of pre-emergent herbicide annually.
- **Owners must mow vegetation between tree rows for plantations or provide a 2 metre access area between trees and adjacent crop field in the case of single row windbreaks.**

Trees Planted by the Landowner

Individual tree and shrub species must be ordered in multiples of 50. Tree order forms must be filled out and returned to the SCRCA as soon as possible. Trees will be allocated on a first come basis, therefore the sooner your order form is return the more likely it is for you to get your desired species and quantities. You will be notified in April when and where to pick up your tree order. Please see the reverse for available species and costs.

- Above trees are ordered from private nurseries.
- Above prices include, transportation of trees to Strathroy, cold storage and handling.

Planting Stock Age Classes –

Bare root stock is often sold using an age class designation, such as 1+0, 3+0 or 1+2. The first number refers to the amount of years spent in a seedbed. For example, a **3+0** designation means the tree spent three years in a seed bed. The second number refers to the number of years spent in a transplant bed. For example, **1+2** designation means the tree spent one year in a seedbed, then lifted and planted in a transplant bed and grown for another two years (transplant improves root development and increases stem calliper).

Plug plants are seedlings raised in small, individual cells of peat moss. The root system is smaller than a bare root seedling, generally 2" x 4" in size. A one year old plug seedling would be referred to as a **P+1**
