Tree Seed Collector Training & Mentorship Program October 2017

Every autumn when the leaves are getting ready to fall, many trees are also preparing to drop their seeds. Since trees are genetically adapted to growing conditions in their region, nurseries need to purchase locally collected seed. The problem is, there are very few people gathering seed in Southwestern Ontario. By becoming a seed collector, you will be aiding in the future sustainability of local forestry.

The tree seed collection seasons occur during spring and fall, with the bulk of tree species dropping their seed over a few weeks in September and October. Collecting seed is a great way to support conservation efforts while earning some extra money, all you need is to be able and willing to collect, process, and transport seed.

Through this hands-on training and mentorship program, offered by the St. Clair Region Conservation Authority and sponsored by Enbridge, learn from expert seed collectors, Ron Thayer and Brian Swaile, at a one-day course. After attending the course, the SCRCA will continue mentoring and working with the new seed collectors on an annual basis.
