

SCHEDULE 3 - CONDITIONS

The Applicant, by acceptance and in consideration of the issuance of this permit, agrees to the following conditions and statements:

1. Conservation Authority Lands are multi-purpose and multi-use areas for everyone to enjoy. Please be aware that there may be other people present on the property and exercise extreme caution to ensure the safety of everyone present. Be certain of your line of fire and backstop. If you are not sure, do not shoot. HUNT SMART, HUNT SAFE.
2. The St Clair Region Conservation Authority (SCRCA) permits Ontario residents to hunt/trap on selected W. Darcy McKeough Floodway Lands (see Schedule 5) to promote wildlife health and sustainability and subject to all federal, provincial, and municipal, laws, rules, regulations, bylaws, seasons, limits, and restrictions set out in the current Ontario Hunting Regulations, Migratory Game Bird Hunting Regulations and all game and wildlife laws. The Conservation Authority has incorporated additional rules and limitations for the safety of the public, the conservation of wildlife, and the safety of you and fellow hunters/trappers.
3. The Applicant shall read and agree to comply with these Conditions prior to the start of any hunting or trapping activities. If the applicant's status changes from what was provided, the SCRCA should be contacted for further review.
4. The SCRCA does not exempt the Applicant from complying with all other approvals, laws, statutes, or regulations from any other Authority. It is the responsibility of the Applicant to ensure that all other agency approvals are in place prior any hunting or trapping activities commencing. This includes all federal, provincial, and municipal laws, rules, regulations, bylaws, seasons, limits, and restrictions set out in the current Ontario Hunting Regulations, Migratory Game Bird Hunting Regulations, and all game and wildlife laws. Additional SCRCA rules have also been implemented to promote the conservation of wildlife and to protect the safety of the Applicant and other participants.
5. A permit, signed by a representative of the SCRCA, constitutes permission to hunt and/or trap only on the assigned McKeough Lands as detailed on the permit itself. The Applicant must always carry the permit on their person.
6. This permit is non-transferable and is for a single applicant only. Groups larger than 5 are prohibited.
7. Applicants must carry a form of government-issued photo identification and present the identification and permit to: MNR Conservation Officer(s); OPP Officer(s); or any employee or agent of the SCRCA when requested as proof of identification and permission. The vehicle permit must be displayed on the windshield of the vehicle.
8. The permit issued by the SCRCA entitles the Applicant to perform hunting/trapping activities only on those lands owned by the SCRCA that have been designated accordingly and that are listed on the "Hunting Map and Property Descriptions" in Schedule 5 of this document. Hunting/trapping activities outside these designated areas is strictly prohibited.

9. The issuance of Hunting/Trapping permits on designated SCRCA-owned lands is performed on a first-come, first-serve basis.
10. The Applicant must be a member of the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters and in good standing. The SCRCA will provide all Applicant-pertinent information to the OFAH to confirm membership.
11. If accompanied by a dog(s), the applicant must always have complete care and control of their dog(s). Neither the Applicant nor their dog(s) may enter any growing or standing crop or enter any pasture containing livestock on SCRCA lands. Hunting is permitted on pasture lands owned by the SCRCA, but the applicant must exercise caution and discretion to ensure a safe and legal hunt.
12. The use of motorized vehicles of any kind is strictly prohibited. No vehicles, snowmobiles and/or off-road vehicles shall be taken onto any of the properties - either on laneways or off for any reason. Agricultural Tenants, CA staff, Contractor's, etc. may require access to these lands.
13. The use of tree stands shall be limited to self-climbing or ladder stands. Tree stands shall not be attached (bolted, screwed, lagged) to any trees or inflict any damage on any tree on SCRCA lands. Tree stands shall be removed from the property no later than January 15th and must not be installed any earlier than September 15th. Tree stands found in contravention to the above will be removed without warning and at the owner's expense. The Conservation Authority assumes no responsibility for tree stands, blinds, or any other hunting equipment left on Authority property.
14. Tree stands, game cameras, ground blinds, etc. must be clearly labeled with the name of the Applicant. Any unidentified equipment will be removed at the Applicant's expense.
15. Trapping permits will be limited to one per property.
16. Hunting is permitted from September 1st of this year till May 31st of the following year or until the expiry date as detailed on this Permit. Hunting/trapping is not permitted from June 1st to August 31st.
17. Trap/target shooting, or any other use of a firearm or bow, not related to the act of hunting is strictly prohibited on SCRCA lands.
18. A mandatory animal harvest record must be submitted to the SCRCA by the Second Monday of June - even if your hunting/trapping season was unsuccessful. Applicants who fail to submit a report may not receive a permit for the following season. The Animal Harvest Report can be found on Schedule 4 of this document.
19. Applicants are expected to review and comply with the current requirements of all game laws, federal, provincial, and municipal, rules, regulations, bylaws, licenses, and permits for the WMU 93A while hunting/trapping in the McKeough Floodway Project Properties. Controlled Deer Hunt Zone Draw Applications must be received 2 weeks before the opening day of the controlled deer hunt season that you wish to hunt.
21. During the Controlled Deer Hunt, a hunter will be permitted to apply to hunt CA lands for one of the controlled deer hunt seasons and may only hunt in the zone(s) that they have been designated for the safety and wellbeing of all hunters.
22. During the two controlled deer hunt seasons, only deer hunting will be permitted, and all other hunting activities will be suspended for the safety of all hunters.
23. The SCRCA reserves the right to suspend any and all hunting/trapping activities for any reason including, but not limited to: allowing staff and contractors to work safely on the properties, for the safety of the public, or for the preservation of wildlife.
24. The Applicant(s) agrees:
- a) to indemnify and save harmless on a solicitor and client basis, the SCRCA and its officers, employees, or agents, from and against all damage, loss, costs, claims, demands, actions, and proceedings, arising out of or resulting from any act or omission of the Applicant relating to any of the particulars, terms or conditions of this permit.
 - b) that this permit shall not release the applicant from any legal liability or obligation and remains in force subject to all limitations, requirements and liabilities imposed by law.
25. Any person(s) caught in violation of the conditions above may result in the violator(s) hunting/trapping privileges being suspended for the rest of the hunting/trapping season and may result in the violator(s) not receiving a hunting/trapping permit for subsequent year(s). Failure to comply with all parts of this document may result in loss of hunting/trapping privileges and possible intervention from the OPP and/or MNRF Conservation Officer, all at the Applicant's expense.
26. CONVICTIONS UNDER THE GAME LAWS WILL RESULT IN REVOKING PERMISSION INDEFINITELY. CONVICTIONS UNDER THE TRESPASS TO PROPERTY ACT WILL RESULT IN THE REVOKING OF PERMISSION FOR A PERIOD OF 5 YEARS. ANY FEES WILL NOT BE RETURNED.
